

FAQ

1) will the information about politics/ legislation that is actually happening be reliant on user inputting data, a research team or outside source that is linked into the website?

- a good deal of that information about legislation that is underway is publicly available; often from the city halls and capitol buildings themselves through APIs. Where that fails short, there are other sites like sunlight foundation which also provides APIs and even some analysis.
- In all things relating to content, think about all the media people of producing today for no payoff whatsoever. Think about how essentially powerless that media is. Think about all the people out there who know things, who are facing things in life, or have professional experience in domains relating to public policy. Think about all the people that call into the talk shows, all the people that read the books, all of that. These people will be our core user group, likely some several million of them.

2) Where is the funding coming from, & how will funding be sustained? Is it individual fundraised, individual supported, loans ect?

- Initial funding will come from people just like you and me, this will be crowd funded and on an ongoing basis member funded. Think PBS, NPR and especially Wikipedia.
- WeLeadUSA will be framed as a public utility, a public service, one that the public should pay for and something that would have a very small price tag for the platform it will create.

- No existing partners, which is a weakness however WeLeadUSA might not need that many if the one or ones we find are strategically chosen. Looking to work with College Republicans, College Democrats, Veterans Group and other Political Non-Profit Groups

4) How will the WeLeadUsa network be spread- who will be the initial user, if it is user driven, what happens at the start if users do not sign up?

- if people don't sign up, it is unlikely WeLeadUSA will see any daylight. WeLeadUsa is going to launch, and people either see this the way we think they should, or they will not. Brigade media will have a say and could create a David Goliath dynamic that potentially could create a great deal of attention for our message even beyond our ambitions at chance to operate.
- Targets: Academics, Veterans, Political Advocacy Groups, Students

5) What exactly are we looking for in terms of support- researchers, data inputers, media center or simply being the initial users?

- Coalescing of a youth group could offer great press and public relations opportunities. It would be great for a bunch of people to stand with us, be involved with some event type efforts, perhaps speak to the press should we be able to create an opportunity for that, any and all in that domain. Creating a video could be very helpful.
- Research- Using the latest primary results to show the state of the Political System and how competitive races actually are.
- Any support provided would be extremely beneficial.
